- Assistance with estate planning and farm succession planning

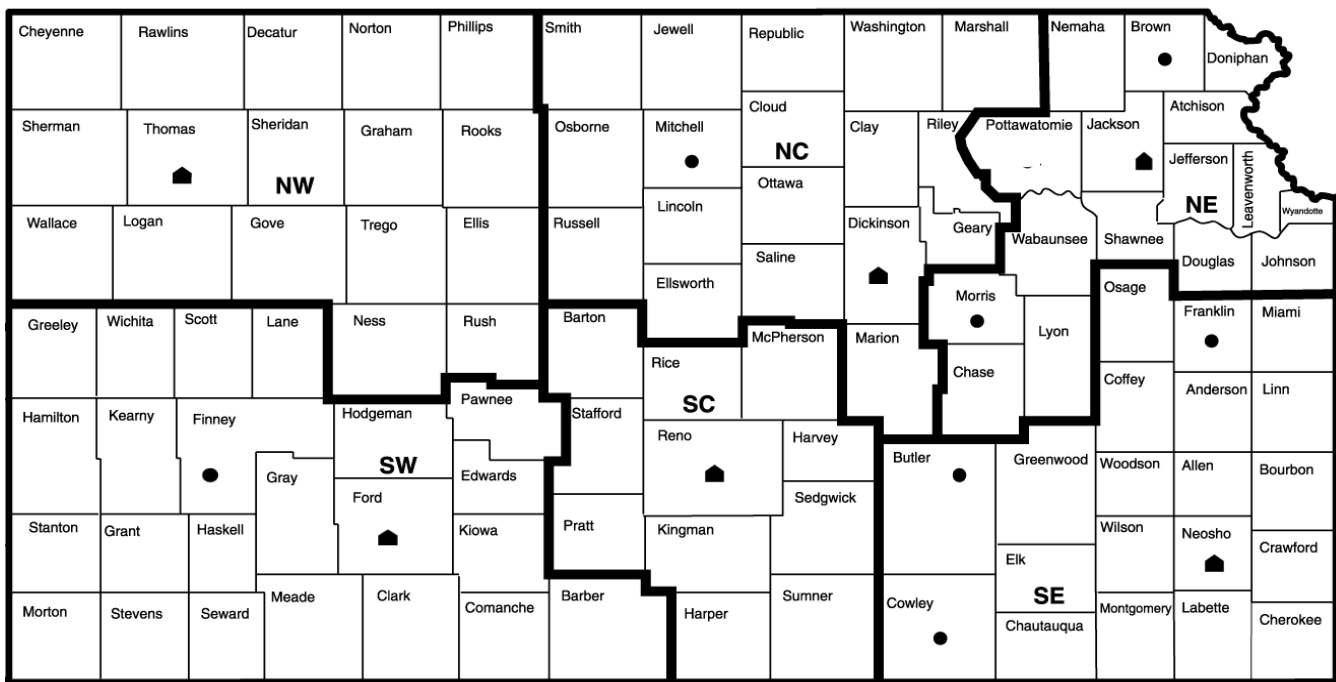
