


Seminar with Roger McEowen

We learned the importance of having Kansas residents provide marketing to foreign nations for the promotion of Kansas grain products. We also better understand how grain is graded for quality.

The extrusion mill provided an insight to the wide variety of products produced by the extrusion process. The feed mill is more complex than a normal feed mill with its bio tech abilities. It is also used to mix a wide array of feed mixes for the university's livestock.

The Wheat Innovation Center showed us how new wheat varieties are born in half the time it used to take and the vast library of wheat varieties from the world over.
