#### WHAT WE'VE LEARNED

#### Kansas non-operating landowners:

- View young producers as riskier
- Are interested in seeing a YP's financial history before leasing...
- "Say" they are not going to charge YP's more per acre

#### WHERE TO NEXT?

#### Willingness-to-Lease Study

- Determine if Kansas landowners will truly help a young producer out by not requiring more \$\$ per acre
- Determine if Kansas landowners place monetary value on relationship (stranger vs. acquaintance vs. family/friend)
