







SHOCK #3 Consumer Meat Demand

- •Recession
- ➤ Weaker Meat Demand (<u>typically</u> at least)
- Stimulus & Spending
- ➤ Supports Demand (April incomes were up!)
- >VERY divergent consumer spending






Meat Prices, Demand Trends & 2021 Outlook




Retail Meat Price Patterns in 2020 (BLS)







2021: Q1=14.6 lbs Q2=13.8 lbs Q3=14.1 lbs Q4=14.1 lbs YR: -3.1% vs 20'
2022: Q1=14.4 lbs Q2=13.5 lbs Q3=13.9 lbs Q4=13.7 lbs YR: -2.0% vs 21'


Meat Demand Insights

- 1. "K-Shaped" Economy & Meat Demand
 - > Averages are easily misleading....

CARES Act Payments

- >85% of residents
- · Mainly received in April-June
 - 34% = \$1,001-\$1,500
 - 20% = \$2,001-\$2,500











Take-Home Summary Points
